Bingo Strategies?

Recently, we ran across several articles on strategies for winning Bingo and they all mentioned “The Tippet Method” and The Granville Method” specifically. Bingo results depend on the drawn numbers, so there’s no way for players to manipulate or guess the outcome – so neither of these strategies will make you a Bingo winner – but we thought they were interesting reading, nonetheless. A few tips that actually will improve your odds below.

The Tippet Method

British statistician L.H.C. Tippet came up with a complex theory about randomness that may or may not be true (there is no statistical evidence supporting the theory). Tippet’s theory suggests the more numbers called in a bingo game, the more likely those numbers will

gravitate towards the median number. For example, if there are 75 bingo balls in play, and it’s a short game, choose cards with numbers closer to 1 and 75. If it’s a long game, choose numbers that are closer to the median number 45. Skilled bingo players will know which games will go for longer and which games are usually decided in fewer calls.

The Granville Method

This method came from Joseph E. Granville, a financial analyst and writer. Granville’s strategy requires players to select their cards based on the balance of the numbers and their long-run probability of being drawn. Based on Granville’s strategy, players must assume that operators will call an equal amount of low, high, even, and odd numbers. When applying Granville’s method to

Gaming News

History Making Payout

A player at a Michigan casino recently turned an ordinary blackjack hand into a history-making payout. The Indiana man identified as Anthony W. won \$1.3 million on the Blackjack Triple Diamond Progressive while playing at FireKeepers Casino Hotel in Battle Creek. He placed a \$5 Bonus Spin Xtreme progressive side bet during a standard game when the mystery “must-hit” progressive was randomly triggered. His very first call after the big win? To his mom, of course. “Momma, we are out of the hood,” he said in video that has since gone viral. “We’re leaving tomorrow.” Bonus Spin Xtreme is an optional progressive side bet available on select table games at FireKeepers Casino, including Blackjack, Poker, Craps, Roulette, and Baccarat. The wager uses three virtual wheels – the community prize wheel, hot-spot wheel, and hot-spot prize wheel – to determine bonus payouts for participating players.

Horses Allowed to Play Slots?

If you invite a Clydesdale to press the spin button on your

machine and the jackpot hits, does the horse get the W-2G? Apparently to promote the Indian National Finals Rodeo at South Point Arena & Equestrian Center, an impromptu parade followed a Clydesdale right through the middle of a casino. A couple of videos of the parade were reposted by VegasSlotsOnline. They’re worth a peek – and be sure to read the comments for a smile.

Train Cost Skyrockets

The cost to build Brightline West, the private high-speed rail line between southern California and Las Vegas, has ballooned all the way up to \$21.5 billion. Brightline is seeking a \$6 billion loan from the federal Department of Transportation to help cover the nearly \$10 billion shortfall and is looking to raise another \$5.5 billion in a stock sale. The initial projection was a total price tag of \$12.5 billion, though some reports we’re seeing now peg that sum at \$16 billion. Either way, the increased costs are attributed to rising labor, material, and technology expenses.

Best Dealer Crowned

Though it’s been held in Europe for a couple of decades, a Best Dealer tournament made its American debut at G2E this fall. A total of 34 dealers from around the country competed in tests of their skills in deal-

ing blackjack and roulette, including card pitching and chip racking. The winner, a dealer at Graton casino in northern California, took home a trophy and \$5,000; in second a dealer at Cosmopolitan and third place (Encore) finishers earned \$3,000 and \$2,000, respectively.

Suspicious Betting

Several hours before the winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, Maria Corina Machado, was announced, online bets for the Venezuelan opposition leader spiked on the prediction-market platform Polymarket. According to the *Guardian*, up until Thursday night, Yulia Navalnaya, the economist and widow of former Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny, led the odds against all other candidates listed on Polymarket, while Machado’s odds weren’t quite 4%. Less than two hours later, they’d skyrocketed to 73%, indicating a surge of bets in favor of Machado. One U.S. bettor won \$65,000. The head of the Nobel Institute, which goes to enormous lengths to keep the winners of Nobel prizes a secret in a process developed over a half-century, told a Norwegian newspaper that it was “too early to be certain” if the winner had been leaked, but said he expected an investigation to be launched.

What Does Increase Odds of Winning?

– Playing with more cards is one of the best-known strategies used by players to increase their chances of winning. When playing multiple cards, it’s important to remember, however, that Bingo should be fun and not stressful and that this strategy requires players

to be adept at managing their money, so financial prudence is essential.

– Play when the hall (or online bingo room) is less crowded. Fewer players improves odds of winning.

– Don’t play when tired or unfocused for any reason – missing numbers leads to missing wins.

Lump Sum Social Security Payment?

Dear Savvy Senior,
I've read that the Social Security Administration offers a lump-sum payment to new retirees who need some extra cash. I haven't yet filed for my retirement benefits and would like to find out if this is true. What can you tell me?
– Born In 1958

Dear 1958,
There is indeed a little-known Social Security claiming strategy that's been around for many years that can provide retirees a lump-sum benefit, but you need to be past your full retirement age to be eligible, and there are financial drawbacks you need to be aware of too.

First, let's review the basics. Remember that while workers can begin drawing their Social Security retirement benefits anytime between ages 62 and 70, full retirement age is 66 and 8 months for those born in 1958, but it rises in two-month increments every birth year to age 67 for those born in 1960 and later.

At full retirement age, you are entitled to 100 percent of your benefits. But if you claim earlier, your benefits will be reduced by 5 to 6.66 percent every year you start before your full retirement age. While if you delay taking your benefits beyond your full retirement age, you'll get 8 percent more each year until age 70.

Lump Sum Option

If you are past full retirement age, and have not yet filed for your benefits, the Social Security Administration offers a retroactive lump-sum payment that's worth six months of benefits.

Here's how it works. Let's say for example that you were planning to delay taking your Social Security benefits past your full retirement age of 66 and 8 months, but you changed your mind at 67 and two months. You could then claim a lump-sum payment equal to those six months of benefits. So, for instance, if your full retirement age benefit was \$2,500 per month, you would be entitled to a \$15,000 lump sum payment.

If you decided at age 67 that you wanted to file retroactively, you'd get only four months' worth of benefits in your lump sum, because SSA rules prohibit you from claiming benefits that pre-date your full retirement age.

Drawbacks

The downside to this strategy is that once you accept a lump-sum payment, you'll lose the delayed retirement credits you've accrued, and your future monthly retirement benefit will be reduced to reflect the amount you already received. It will also affect your future survivor benefit to your spouse or other eligible family members after you die.

You may also need to consider Uncle Sam. Depending on your income,

Social Security benefits may be taxable, and a lump-sum payment could boost the amount of benefits that are taxed.

The federal government taxes up to 50 percent of Social Security benefits at ordinary income tax rates if your combined income – defined as adjusted gross income plus nontaxable interest income plus half of your Social Security benefits – exceeds \$25,000, and up to 85 percent of benefits are taxable if combined income exceeds \$34,000. For married couples, the comparable income thresholds for taxing benefits are \$32,000 and \$44,000. To help you calculate this, see IRS Publication 915 *Social Security and Equivalent Railroad Retirement Benefits* at IRS.gov/pub/irs-pdf/p915.pdf, or call 800-829-3676 and ask them to mail you a copy.

In addition, if the lump-sum payment of retroactive Social Security benefits boosts your yearly income over \$106,000 (or \$212,000 for married couples filing jointly), it will increase your future Medicare premiums too. See Medicare.gov/Pubs/pdf/11579-medicare-costs.pdf for details.


